

# YASMINA



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*The scarf is knitted in one piece, there is only a few centimeters of sewing involved.*

# YASMINA

## Material

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- 100g Faery Wings from Fyberspates (67% Silk, 23% Mohair, 10% Nylon)
- Knitting needles 3,5mm

## Size

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One size, overall length is about 32inch (83 cm)

## Gauge

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24 stitches in stockinette = 10cm

## Cable pattern

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Row 1 (RS): \* 4 front crossing\*

Row 2 (WS): purl

Row 3: knit 2, \*4 back crossing\*, ending with 2 knit

Row 4: purl

## Abbreviations

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- RS right side
- WS wrong side
- DS double stitch = knit front and back (1 stitch increased)
- 4 front crossing: bring 2 stitches on a cable needle in front of the work, knit the next 2 stitches, knit the stitches from the cable needle
- 4 back crossing: bring 2 stitches on a cable needle in back of the work, knit the next 2 stitches, knit the stitches from the cable needle

## Hints

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- Please read the instructions carefully before beginning!
- Your Gauge is not really important for this – just start knitting!
- The first stitch of every row should be slipped with yarn in back. The last stitch of every row has to be purled. This gives a neat border for the scarf. The selvedge stitches are not mentioned in the instructions.
- You can start with a provisional cast-on as well if you prefer to have a very neat seam in the back.
- The number of stitches will slightly increase over the length – you will have more stitches on the needle at the end than in the beginning!

# YASMINA

## Instructions

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- Cast on 38 stitches. Start knitting in open work in 2 knit, 2 purl for 30 Rows.
- Knit two rows
- Now start knitting the cable pattern for 36 rows (9 pattern repeats)
- Knit one row. Increase 3 stitches: one after the first stitch, one after stitch 19, one before the last stitch (=41 stitches)
- Purl one row
- Start knitting the plissé pattern (remember, the selvedge stitches are not given)  
RS: \*knit 7, purl 1\*, ending with knit 7  
WS: knit 3, purl 1, \*knit 7, purl 1\*, ending with knit 3  
Repeat those 2 rows 44 times which gives you a total of 90 rows in plissé pattern.
- Now we have to increase to get the scarf wider at the bottom. After finishing the row you will have 51 stitches (including the selvedge stitches).  
\*Knit 1, DS, knit 3, DS, knit 1, purl 1\* ending with knit 1, DS, knit 3, DS, knit 1  
WS : knit in established pattern: knit 4, purl 1, \*knit 9, purl 1\* ending with knit 4  
RS: \*knit 9, purl 1\*, ending with knit 9  
WS: knit in established pattern  
Repeat those 2 rows for 34 times more (70 rows with 51 stitches)
- Now it's time for the next increase, you will have 61 stitches.
- \*Knit 2, DS, knit 3, DS, knit 2, purl 1\* ending with knit 2, DS, knit 3, DS, knit 1
- WS row: knit in established pattern: knit 5, purl 1, \*knit 11, purl 1\* ending with knit 5  
RS: \*knit 11, purl 1\*, ending with knit 11  
Repeat those 2 rows 29 more times (60 rows)
- Cast off all stitches.
- Fold the ribbing from the beginning to the back of the cable pattern. Sew the cast-on row to the end row of the cable pattern. Weave in all ends
- Wear your scarf and enjoy!
